





Sick Day Rules

When should you keep your child home from school if they are sick?

- 1. If your child has had a temperature of 100.4°F or higher in the last 24 hours
- 2. If your child has used ibuprofen (Motrin) or acetaminophen (Tylenol) to lower a fever in the last 24 hours
 - 3. If you child has vomited or had diarrhea in the past 24 hours
- 4. If your child has been diagnosed with a contagious infection that requires antibiotics, such as strep throat, and it has been less than 24 hours since their first dose of the antibiotics.

When can my child return to school?

When all of the following conditions are met:

- 1. It has been more than 24 hours since having a temperature over 100.4°F
- 2. It has been more than 24 hours since the use of acetaminophen or ibuprofen to lower a temperature
 - 3. It has been more than 24 hours since the last episode of vomiting or diarrhea
 - 4. It has been more than 24 hours since starting antibiotics AND conditions 1-3 are met
